New Education Coordinator

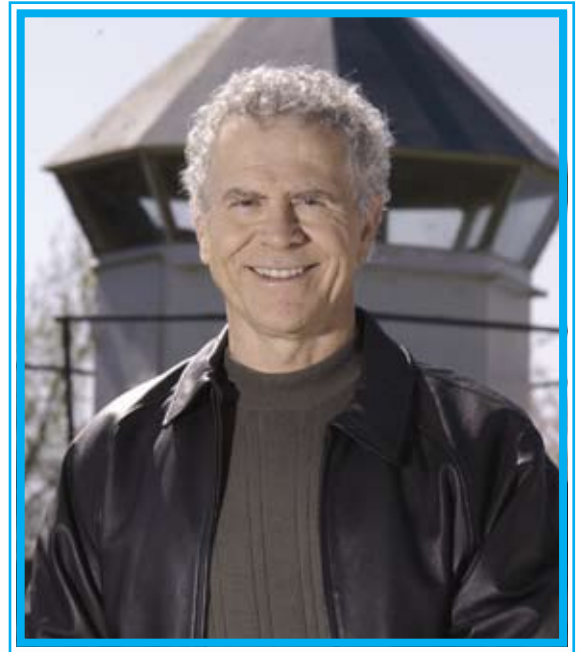

The project begins on September 11 with a free screening of *October Sky* at Maiden Alley Cinema. Community members are

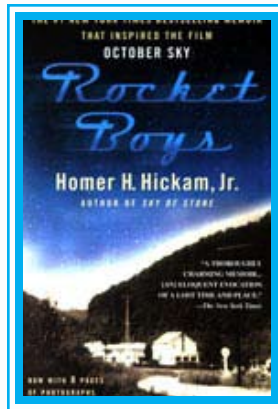

All events are free to the public, but will require tickets available at Clemens Fine Arts Theater Box Office, Maiden Alley Cinema and McCracken County Public Library.

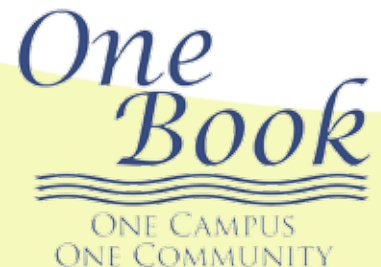

DID YOU KNOW?

⇒ The sun is the largest object in our solar system. More than 1,000,000 Earths could fit into it.

⇒ A space shuttle's main engine weighs about a seventh as much as a train engine but can deliver as much horsepower as 39 locomotives.

⇒ All the planets in our solar system could be placed inside the planet Jupiter.

⇒ The core of the Sun is 27,000,000 degrees Fahrenheit. The surface of the sun is only 10,000 degrees Fahrenheit.

Space Quest 2008

Summer camps for 2008 have come to an end, but the excitement generated for participants will linger for a long time. This summer brought record enrollment for the center, around 385 campers ranging in age from second to eighth grades. Many new camps were added this year, including the very popular CSI (Challenger Special Investigator) Camp where students went in search of the culprit that stole the Mars rocks. A life-size colony was built in Voyage to Mars camps. Many rockets were launched, robots built, stars studied, planets visited and games played in other camps.



Camp lengths range from one day to three days and offer a wide variety of interest areas. Consider sending your children, grandchildren, students, nieces, nephews or neighbors on a summer space quest they won't forget.
